Autumn is truly here with the colder mornings and the leaves changing colour rapidly. A good time to remind you that children at Bowsland go out in all weathers and need to be dressed appropriately. Healthy Lifestyles: National Child Measurement Programme

Every year, throughout England, children in Reception and Year 6 are being weighed and measured in schools, as part of work to improve children's health and well-being. The Government wants to know how healthy children are so they can decide what more they need to do to help children live healthier lives.
